HCI defines sexual heasement as unvelocing behavior of a sexual nature that relates to the genter or sexual identity of an individual and that has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating offensive or hostile environment for study. This policy applies to all interactions between students and HCI faculty members and other faculty, staff, and achimistrative personnel, and other students.

Conduct alleged to be sexual heasement will be evaluated by considering the totality of the particular circumstances, including the nature, frequency, intensity, location, context, and cluation of the questioned behavior. Repeated incidents or a pattern of heasesing behavior may be cause for serious connective action However; an unescricus incident, even if isolated, may be sufficient cause for action under this policy including referral to lawer forcement when applicable

Q.idpoq.osevel hazanert can occurvitether apeson esists and suffers the theatened harm or the person submits and avoids the theatened harm. Both situations could constitute discrimination on the basis of sex. A hostile environment can be created by pessistent or pervasive conductor by a single severe quiscre. The none severe the conduct, the less meditaries to show an epsitive series of incidents to prove a hostile environment. Severe victoring including rape, severe associlt, and consticand defing victoring is a form of severe hazas ment.

Based on the outcome of the investigation, the Title IX Officer or designee will determine if there is sufficient cause to proceed with the complaint. If so, the Title IX Officer or designee will an argefor an informal resolution conference with the accused (Complainents do not attend informal resolution meetings but are apprised of the meeting's outcome). If the accused does not accept responsibility for the allegations and/or the proposed sanction (s), the Title IX Officer or designee will determine if the evidence variants a formal hearing before the Grievance Committee
